There is a pay and display car park next to The Palace pub but that is usually full with etap customers and is not cheap!

Other alternatives include parking in the suburbs and getting a bus into the city centre. On most main routes there are buses into the centre every 10 mins or so. Be careful you don't park in a residential area that is permit holders only—traffic wardens in Leeds are very enthusiastic!


