Getting there and parking

St Laurence Reading, Friar Street RG1 1DA (Next to the Town Hall)

By road Reading is easily reached via the M4 J11 for the town centre is straightforward, J10 or 12 also work, Sat Navs will give suitable directions.

Below are some parking options (in no particular order)

Q Park Chatham place RG1 7DS £13 for up to 8 hours £8 for up to 5 hours, (11mins walk)

Garrard Street RG1 1NR 314 for 6 hours, £19 up to 12 (5 mins walk)

Station Car park, Vastern road RG1 8BT £11 for up to 4 hours, £18 for up to 9 hours (9 mins walk)

Queens road Car Park,RG1 4AR £10 for up to 5 hours, £12 for up to 6 hours £14 for up to 7 hours (6 mins walk)

Hills meadow car park £4.50 up to 4 hours £6.50 12 hours RG4 8DH (14 mins walk)

There are other carparks in central Reading charging similar amounts, all walking times according to Google

Alternatively the train is a viable option with frequent regular services from London and the south west, and connections to all parts of the country. Reading station is a 7 minute walk from St Laurence.
